Scary, Spooky and Spectacular Stories

Some Samples...

The Kelpie – This is the beautiful and frightening legend from Scotland's western islands of the fearsome "water horse" that lured children to their death and enchanted women as his lovers.

John Tingle – Canadian story of what happens to young men who never help their mother!

The Hedley Koo – The town healer tangles with the terrible Headley Koo who has been haunting that village for years but she is not afraid of changes...

Goblin's Gloves - A folktale from my Welsh heritage, where foxglove is called Goblin's Gloves and was said to attract the hobgoblins who wore the long bells on their fingers as gloves that imparted magical properties...

Mary Culhane – Traditional chilling Irish story of a brave heroine who outwits the dead and saves the day and raised bible sales to everyone in that town!

Lizbeth and the Captain – Lizbeth decides to use the old magic her mother taught her to teach a miserly fishing captain a lesson he'll never forget about sharing his catch with poor widows. A historical tale transplanted to Washington soil and the Columbia River.

Juvie Hall Stories – What The Teens Asked To Hear!

These powerful stories were asked for again and again by the girls and boys at the Juvenile Detention Center (including the gift of their honest reaction to these tales).

The Heartless Giant – Can we lock away that part of us that is vulnerable to pain? This gorgeous old European folktale is about finding friendships and alliances in the most unorthodox of places.

The Grizzly Bear Feast – When an old Tlingit man decides he has outlived his friends and family and it is time to die, the grizzlies teach him that friends are sometimes found when and where we least expect them.

The Red Lion - Ancient Persian story of facing ones fears and coming to grips with loss.

The Wolf's Eyelashes – Japanese folktale of how to tell when someone is telling you the truth.

Lady of the Lake Waters – Celtic tale for domestic violence education and prevention.

Misery – Russian folktale combined with old Hoyt Axton song becomes a chillingly resonant tale of a family surviving the temptations that lead to Misery.

The Stolen Skin – Traditional Celtic story of a man who steals a sealskin to capture the selkie woman it belongs to against her will.

Home-Fried Stories With A Side of Tried and True Folktales

Samples

Stories of my Great Uncle Vince – there are 3 stories of Vince's pyromaniac tendencies (Fireworks, Civil War Cannon, Bonfire) and also a new fishing tale – *The Uncles Visit the Laundromat*

Waving Back – A tender tale of community and hidden gifts - when my family returns to Montana to see our old home, I recall a story of our neighbor, an idiot savant.

The Courtship of Basil and Jeannette – My grandparents met, courted and tried to marry amongst a heap of practical jokes being played upon them!

On the <u>Tried and True Folktales</u> end – The Singing Flute is an old South American folktale that I adapted with my daughter, Breean, about a king who loses his sight and sends his sons out to find the cure.

Many of the other folktales listed in the menus are good here. I've added a new tale - *Death in a Nut*, an old "Jack tale" from Scotland. Jack tricks death and stops him from taking his mama but the rest of the world stops too!

Earth Dancing Round and Round: Seasonal Wonder Tales

I have collected folktales, legends, myths and stories of the history behind the

Summer (June) or Winter (Dec.) Solstice,

Spring (March) or Autumn (September) Equinox

and other Earth Celebrations.

Sample...

<u>When The Sun Was A Woman</u> – This combination discussion and concert features a series of tales illustrating the transition of the sun, once thought of as female, to shift to the sun as a male deity or personality. The first 3 short tales illustrate this progression. The last tale is a mini-Epic from Rumania which follows the transition of a young woman into a young man who marries the sun princess she/he rescues. This tale has it all: magic horses, kings and emperors, genies, magicians, evil witches and even nuns along with a cursing hermit! WHAT A GREAT ADVENTURE!

<u>Corresponding Interactive Seasonal Workshops</u> are offered to explore history, experience the resonance of the tales of each season, and explore the metaphors of the celebrations that stretch back into unrecorded time and are still honored now around the world. Crafts are made corresponding to the seasonal stories.
